1. "A Tank Owners Introduction" | 1 Hr

4. Angels and Demons in Tank Coatings" | 2 Hrs

The underworld of volatile organic compound regulations in high performance coating systems is discussed. The impact of exempt solvents and high solids coatings, formulated to meet the ever increasing regulatory restrictions, is reflected in case histories that define coating performance challenges.

5. Benefits of Ongoing Tank Maintenance" | 1 Hr.

Reviews the AWWA M42 "Steel Tank Manual" and addresses the criticality of tank maintenance through a series of well defines steps that maximizes the service life of typical water storage tanks.

6. Tank Water Quality | 1 Hr.

Identifies the potable water storage tank's role in achieving and maintaining satisfactory water quality with specific reference to the Stage 1 and Stage 2 Disinfection Bi-product regulations and the associated importance of tank cleaning, bio-film eradication and active/passive mixing systems.
